The exemption petition involved working with several trade associations and developing the necessary legitimacy criteria document to allow the use of railroad ties to be used by combustion sources for energy recovery without triggering the emission standards under the Commercial and Industrial Solid Waste Incinerator (CISWI) rules.

Non-Hazardous Secondary Materials (NHSM) Self-Implementing Non-Waste Determination: Assisted with the preparation of a NHSM non-waste determination for an alternate fuel vendor. As part of the project, it was necessary to arrange for analytical data to be developed and then demonstrate that the components to the alternate fuel were processed, had significant heat value, were managed as a valuable commodity, and had contaminant levels comparable to traditional fuels. The NHSM was submitted to U.S. EPA and a request was made to obtain a comfort letter regarding the non-waste status of the alternate fuel.

<u>Develop an Assessment Tool for Non-Hazardous Secondary Materials (NHSM) Non-Waste Determinations, Confidential Client:</u> Developed an Excel-based assessment tool for making a determination that a NHSM could/could not qualify as a non-waste. The tool was developed for environmental staff or fuel purchasing individuals to make a preliminary determination whether a potential alternate fuel had the necessary data to support a non-waste determination per the requirements of 40 CFR Part 241.3.
